What is it?



 The toolkit makes available in one place the collective thinking of a wide range of research and financial support professionals across the N8 universities on how best to share equipment in a complex environment.

The aim and purpose



The aim of the toolkit:

Our aim in making it easier to share equipment is to allow us to do better research more cost-effectively

The purpose of the toolkit:

The purpose is to help the academic community to find the most appropriate solution for their circumstances

Key underlying principles



- To share equipment, where appropriate to do so
- Not a compliance-based approach
- Proportionate

Banding to help with use of the toolkit



Band 1 – New Infrastructure Framework Applies

 Strategic Facilities as defined by N8 Universities that are part of the competitive award winning process and research growth of the 8 universities

Band 2 – New Infrastructure Framework Optional

- Larger pieces of equipment where formal/informal sharing may already exist as a result of collaborative working
- Equipment with the capacity and capability to be shared. For this equipment uptake of the model is optional

Band 3 – New Infrastructure Framework Unlikely to apply

 Smaller equipment that does not normally lend itself to sharing and identified via the N8 database

What does the toolkit contain?



Navigation and pathways through four strands:

- Pricing and Charging
- Health & Safety and Training
- VAT
- Contacts and Legal

What does the toolkit contain?



In addition to four work strands:

- Background and context for the work
- Suggested approaches
- Two case studies
- Worked up examples
- Downloadable templates
- Questions and answers

A flexible and collaborative approach



- Consulted touch stones and critical friends within our respective HEIs
- Work strand leads consulted with academics and other stakeholders
- Took note of good work being developed elsewhere, e.g., M5 group of universities and the SES 5
- Tested ideas as we went along
- Consulted with national bodies who had a policy or regulatory interest, RCUK; HEFCE; HMRC; Govt depts
- Sought legal and financial advice
- Weren't slowed down by not knowing all the answers

Our vision for how it will be used



- Thrive as a living project
- The toolkit to be regarded as a valuable resource for the user community in challenging times ahead
- The user community will want to own the toolkit and be engaged in helping to improve its effectiveness
- Be comfortable that we don't have all the answers next steps approach
- To be of help to the broader HEI sector
